

2022 Road Rehabilitation tentative work for the week of May 23rd:

Phase 1 of the Road Project will be continue on Saturday May 21st with all areas concrete replacement and drainage structure adjustments completed. Clean up, removal of forms and backfilling will take place during the week. Weather depending, work may not be completed until Monday.

Once **Phase 1** is complete all residents should be able to access their driveways and the Police Department has been notified to resume the **NO** overnight parking restrictions beginning the evening of **Wednesday May 25th.**

Phase 2 of this project begin with the milling/grinding of the existing asphalt surface, 2-1/4". Work is scheduled to begin mid-week. The milled pavement will be swept clean and the Village will inspect the asphalt base course to identify any areas to be repaired.

Residents are asked not to park vehicles on any of the streets during the hours of 7:00 am to 7:00 pm (Village working hours).

Once the patching areas have been repaired by the contractor the pavement will be re-cleaned and prepared for asphalt paving. The prime coat (oil) will be placed and sand aggregate placed on top. Prime coat and sand application cures/dries in a short period of time and drivers should drive slowly so it does not track onto your vehicles. A bug/tar cleaner can remove any prime coat tracked onto your vehicles.

The first lift of asphalt being placed is the leveling binder and once the compaction by the rollers is completed the surface can be driven on. This usually takes about 5 minutes, please follow the direction of the contractor's workers and flag persons. Once all of the level binder course has been placed the contractor will proceed with the placement of the final asphalt surface lift.

A light coat of prime may be placed before the surface course, please watch for signs. Motorist should not make any sharp turns on the new surface until it cools enough.

A special note for homeowners, when the prime coat/oil is placed please be cautious of crossing the streets, especially with pets. This also applies when the asphalt surfaces are placed, as the asphalt is very hot and if the air temperatures are high, it takes longer for the pavement to cool down.

School Bus pickup and drop-off, Postal service, and trash pick-up will continue as scheduled.
